 - Only food bank in Milwaukee that does not charge for food, delivery or network membership
 - Breakfasts, lunches and dinners based on family household size and dietary needs.

- Mobile market
 - Grocery store on wheels that travels throughout Milwaukee County to visit neighborhoods and communities that have limited access to fresh and healthy foods
 - Monday - Friday Provides:
 - Fruits, vegetables, milk (dairy and nondairy options), chicken, beef, pork, deli meat, cheese, yogurt, etc
 - Does not sell canned items or processed foods.
 - Accepts debit cards, credit cards and Quest EBT

- Senior Stockbox Program
 - Distributes a free box of healthy food for people age 60+ who have a monthly income of \$1,580 or less per month (\$2,137 for a two-person household).
 - Stockboxes include:
 - Cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese

 - Provides meals to children during the summer Allows families to save money on food Ensures children have access to healthy meals
 - Encourages participation in recreational and educational activities

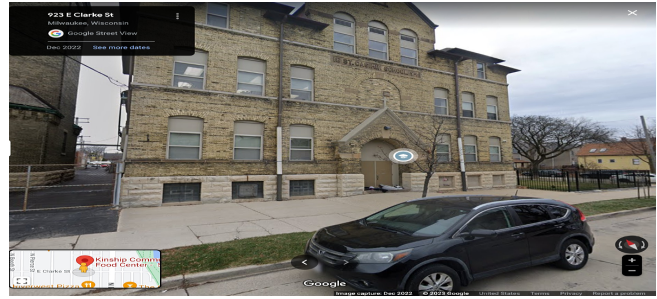

Important Information:

- Low-barrier housing refuge for individuals who are currently homeless and experiencing severe and persistent mental health challenges.
- Alternative to emergency shelter and is designed to provide safe, short-term housing along with supportive services, including peer support, for residents as they transition out of homelessness
- Has 20 housing units Referrals accepted
- Criteria
 - Must be 18 years or older must have a mental illness
 - Must meet the HUD definition of homeless:
 - Are trading sex for housing?
 - Are staying with friends, but cannot stay there for longer than 14 days
 - Are being trafficked?
 - Left home because of physical, emotional, or financial abuse or threats of abuse and have no safe, alternative housing?

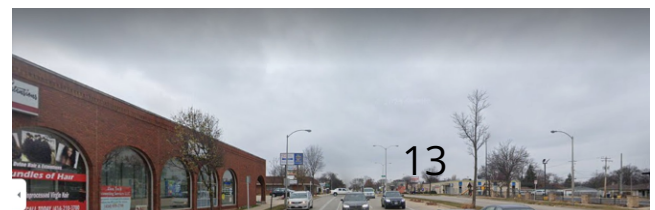

 - A daytime refuge offering safety, security, sobriety, and spiritual renewal
 - Living Room
 - A welcoming environment to reconnect with themselves and others
 - Community
 - A community of at-risk, homeless men and women in transition
 - Center Ownership
 - Previously homeless Members act as ambassadors to visitors.
 - Breach Café
 - Licensed soup kitchen offering nutritious breakfast and warm mid-day meals

- English Language Learning (ELL)
 - Small group or classroom with an instructor (online or face-to-face):
 - Study English with a professional teacher and other students
 - Class schedules and modes vary depending on level and location.

- One-on-one tutoring (online or face-to-face):
 - Twice a week.
 - 60-90 minutes sessions
 - Scheduled according to student needs and tutor availability.

- Learning labs (face-to-face):
 - Guided independent study

- Requirements:
 - Complete standard ELL tutor onboard training
 - Commit to volunteering for a period of 6 months
 - Clearly communicate expectations and requirements of your program to both the cooperating instructor and Manager of ELL Programs

- U.S. Citizenship Education Program
 - Learn english skills and U.S. civics content required to pass the USCIS naturalization exam and interview

- Online High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED) Program
 - Requirements:
 - At least 18.5 years of age
 - The class you entered 9th grade with has graduated
 - Proof of Wisconsin residency
 - Not currently enrolled in a public high school
 - Strong computer skills: internet browsing, basic typing, creating documents, responding via email, and using other online apps as needed
 - Qualifying scores on TABE test—to be scheduled upon intake

- Training Ready Program
 - helps students gain entrance into training programs for the manufacturing and construction trades by helping them build requisite reading and math skills

- College/Accuplacer Prep
 - helps students prepare for college entrances exams and aid them in enrolling in post-secondary education

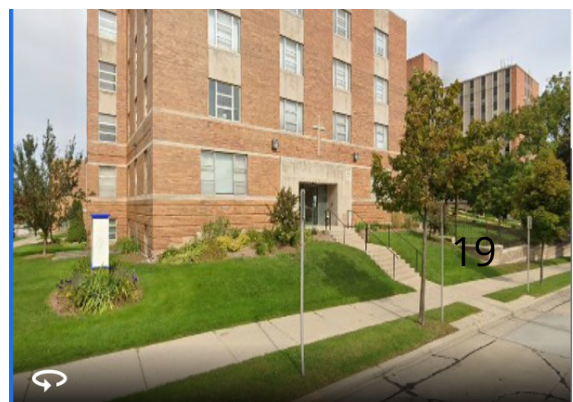


Adult Learning Center

- Fall semester runs from September through December
- Spring semester runs from January through May
- Tuition is just \$20 per semester!
- Remote/"virtual" classes
- In-person classes:
 - You must show proof of COVID vaccination
- TABE test appointment
 - required to register
 - In person (at the ALC in Milwaukee)
 - Remotely/from home in a live video session
 - Must have a computer, laptop, or Chromebook device with a video camera and microphone to test remotely.

- Computers MUST be running the "Google Chrome" browser
- Phones and/or tablets can not be used
- Must have a quiet environment, uninterrupted for up to 2 hours, that has reliable internet service.
- After that, everything else can be conducted online: classwork, live meetings with teachers, 1-to-1 tutoring, assignments and homework, and even final GED exams!

 - You feel constant pain and/or stomach discomfort
 - You feel unusually tired, or energetic, all of the time
 - You feel very agitated or restless
