Food pantries in the city of Racine and eastern Racine county have specific eligibility requirements and coordinate with IMPACT 211 to help people access emergency food. IMPACT 211 can help determine the most appropriate referral based on your location; ensure you know which documents are required; and provide additional instructions. Generally, you receive an allotment of emergency food based on household size to last a minimum of three days. Emergency food assistance can be accessed once every 30 days.

Kingdom Manna Food Pantry

Kingdom Manna Food Pantry is a part of F.I.N.A.O., which stands for "failure is not an option." They are a faith-based organization whose mission is to serve those in the community.

- children/dependent forms of ID:
 - Birth certificate
 - Immunization record
 - Student ID
- If the address on the ID of the adults does not match that of their current residence, they must bring something proving their current address, such as a piece of mail.
- ****no social security cards or Forward cards can be accepted as identification****

 - If the family has a male over the age of 12 or a single adult male in it, they can provide a hotel voucher or make a referral to another shelter
- Those that qualify for the transitional living program can be provided shelter services up to 90 days
 - Mandatory parts of the program include job searching, mental health care, life skills development, financial planning, etc.
- TLC also ensures that their past residents are still meeting their needs even after they have moved out of the shelter, through their continuum of care

Oxford House Angie Pio/Joe Prott

Oxford house is a widely implemented program meant to provide shelter and a place to recover from drug and alcohol addiction. They are described as being democratically run, self-sufficient, and drug free.

 - Participants have to be at least 18 years old at the time of their community reentry
 - Individuals must have been incarcerated at a DOC facility in Wisconsin
 - Individuals must be determined to be medium or high risk via COMPAS results
- The program starts pre-release. Once individuals are identified as a good fit for the program and are accepted into the program, they will meet one on one with a Second Chance program case manager to build a relationship up until their release.

- Once back in the community, the individual will continue to meet with their case manager, set goals, etc.

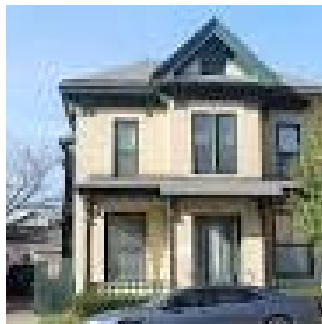

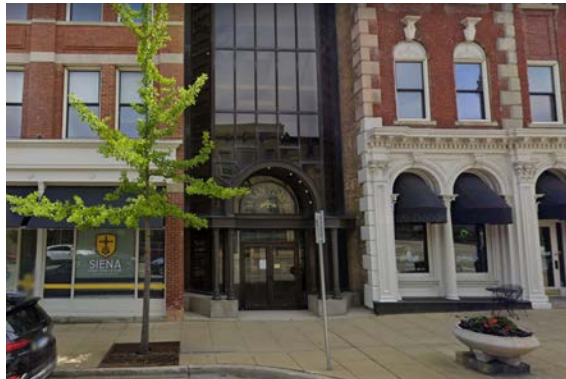
