 - CTR's instructions state to come to the West entrance and walk inside, so that volunteers may assist you.
- When you sign up to receive food, you will be asked about your family size so the prepackaged bags of groceries can be adjusted accordingly.

Father Carr's Food Pantry

Father Carr's is another faith-based organization with the overarching goal to serve the community. They have resources for food insecurity, healthcare services, and shelter.

Father Carr's operates a drive-thru pantry every Friday, and a non-perishable pantry called the Daily Bread.

Important Information:

- Eligibility for Affordable Housing application: Rentals may be available to individuals or families whose total household income is under 80% of the County Median Income. Rentals are prioritized for individuals and families enrolled in other ADVOCAP programs, especially those involved in the Homeless Prevention Programs. Rental may also be available for disabled individuals who live with 2-4 other adults in the same home, sharing living costs and case management or care staff. Applications need to include income verifications including employment, SSI, SSDI, Child Support, and any other additional income.
- Eligibility for Homeless Assistance Program: Persons must be homeless, at imminent risk of homelessness (court ordered eviction, having to leave a motel etc.), or fleeing/attempting to flee domestic violence. In order to contact ADVOCAP for homeless assistance, you must contact a Family Development Specialist in your area for next steps and resources (the numbers for which are listed below) and participate in a Coordinated Entry Survey.

COTS Residential Program

COTS provides temporary living solutions for those struggling to find stable housing. Individuals in the residential program also learn living skills while in the program, to help them achieve independence.

- Every person wishing to stay at COTS is required to fill out an application in order to receive residential placement
- They must also participate in the Living Skills program
- Applications can be submitted only or printed and sent in by email, fax, drop box, or U.S. Mail.
- There are separate facilities in Oshkosh for men and women, and serve single men and women, as well as young adults and veterans.
- There is a \$285 program fee and a one-time \$100 security deposit.
- The application *does* ask for a criminal record as well as three references.

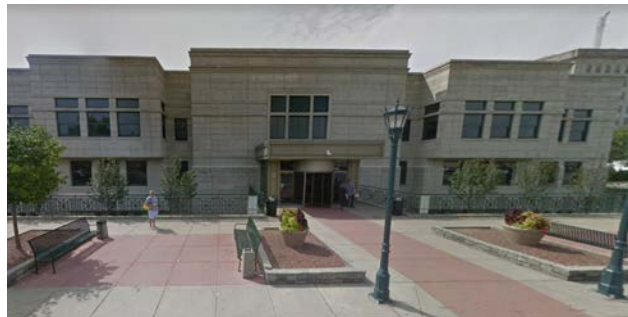

- Eligibility requirements: household income must be at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Guideline. New clients must bring income documentation, such as their most recent tax return or W-2, two months check stubs, unemployment check stubs, or a social security income statement. If after completing the financial assessment and are ineligible for services, they will offer healthcare services in the community that you can utilize.

Partnership Community Health Center

This health center provides medical, dental, and mental health services to individuals experiencing homelessness. They provide on site care at the Emergency Shelter of the Fox Valley region as well as other temporary housing facilities. There is a nurse practitioner, substance abuse counselor, and outreach team that work with individuals experiencing homelessness.

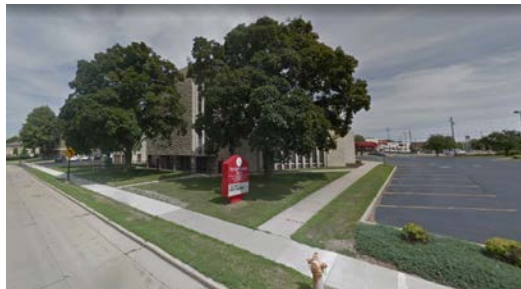

- The cost of a 28 day inpatient stay at NOVA is \$6,300 when paid directly by the client.
- Prior to intake, there is a pre-screening done just to ensure the goodness of fit in the NOVA program.
- If you have to detox, NOVA will not take you until after you have detoxed at a safe medical facility, such as a hospital.
- NOVA has a 90-day transitional living house called Terra House for individuals that have already completed primary inpatient treatment. This program is a four step process, and implements the 12-step program commonly seen in Alcoholics Anonymous.
