Food Share Program (Formerly Food Stamps)

The FoodShare Program helps families who have little money buy nutritious food. If your family qualifies for the WIC Program, you may already qualify for FoodShare under new state guidelines.

You've probably heard of food stamps or SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). In Wisconsin, we call the program FoodShare. The goal of this program is to stop hunger.

You can use your FoodShare benefits at most stores. You also can use them at many farmers markets, where you can buy fresh fruits and vegetables most months out of the year.

People all over Wisconsin get help from FoodShare. We help people of all ages who:

- Have low-income jobs
- Live on a small or fixed income
- Are retired
- Have lost their jobs
- Are disabled and can't work




- The hospital offers 14 specialties, 25 inpatient beds, and has an Emergency Department.

Waushara County Mental Health Services

This unit provides Outpatient Mental Health services, including psychiatric, psychological, as well as individual and family counseling to Waushara County residents of all ages. For more information contact 920-787-6550.

• UNIT SERVICES:

- 24-Hour Crisis Service & Involuntary Commitments: Mobile, walk-in and telephone service.
- o Psychotherapy: Individual, marital and family therapy is provided.
- Psychiatric Services: Board-certified psychiatry for evaluations & ongoing medications.
- Consultation/Education: Consultation available to schools, institutions, agencies and individuals on mental health.
- Coordinated Service Team: Strength based and family centered team process for children and families with multiple needs to assist agencies and schools to work together and provide more comprehensive care.
- Comprehensive Community Services: CCS is a Psychosocial Rehabilitation program
 designed for consumers with Medicaid and who have a mental health or substance use
 diagnosis. This program provides a team and strength based approach to assist
 consumers in meeting their goals and reaching their full potential.
- Community Support Program: The Community Support Program serves people with chronic, severe and persistent mental illnesses and are at the greatest risk for admission to mental health hospitals. The CSP program utilizes the services of psychiatrists, a psychologist, nurses, and social workers to implement and oversee treatment provisions. The program also utilizes trained paraprofessionals including mental health technicians to make regular contacts in the community. Services are billable to Medicaid. Treatment provision within CSP is directed toward providing the necessary supports to individuals in order that they remain in the community and out of costly psychiatric inpatient facilities. These residents are the most vulnerable population of people who have mental illnesses and at greatest risk of decompensation without community support. Provided services include medication monitoring, assistance with activities of daily living, money management, linkage to and utilization of appropriate community resources, supported employment/sheltered workshop activities, socialization skills, symptom management and coping techniques, and management of a variety of medical and AODA issues.
